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interesting to scholars because they are believed to be an offshoot of the group that lived in Qumran, near the Dead Sea. In 1947, a Bedouin shepherd stumbled into a cave containing various ancient artifacts and jars containing manuscripts

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describing the beliefs of the sect and events of the time.

Pharisees, Sadducees & Essenes Nazarene Essenes interpreted the theology of the Way in a manner described as much more mystical.

A useful example of this more mystical understanding is the use of the term "Son of Man," (Lk. 22.66-71).\* Son of Man is understood as a proper name and a soul of heavenly origin, literally, a divine anointed one who had not yet been revealed.
